#### **DISCUSSION: THE NIGHT OF IDEAS**

Launched in 2016 by the Institut français, The Night of Ideas is an invitation to gather and reflect on today's major global challenges.

Through talks, artistic performances, film screenings, workshops, and conferences, this international event celebrates the free circulation of ideas around a shared theme.

Held in over 100 countries, it brings together French and international voices from a wide range of disciplines, within spaces dedicated to culture and knowledge.

In 2025, the chosen theme is "Taking Action", a reflection on the ability of governments, civil societies, and individuals to act in the face of geopolitical upheaval and the erosion of social cohesion.

This event is presented in partnership with the Institut français du Canada and the Embassy of France in Canada.



### <u>DANCE PERFORMANCE</u>: MOSAÏCO Saturday, November 29 2025

#### Westbury Theatre, Fringe Theatre

MOSAÏCO blends dance and digital art to celebrate the richness of diverse identities.

Through a sensitive choreographic creation, the performance explores the legacies passed down by our family origins and the territories that shape us. Between movement and imagery, it offers a profound reflection on the construction of identity.

Flamenco, traditional Québécois, African, Latin, and urban dances come together on stage in a vibrant tribute to the many roots of our society. Five dancers with diverse cultural backgrounds embody this quest for identity through a dynamic and expressive physical language.

Their movements interact with a responsive digital projection, forming a living mosaic that transforms with their gestures. Poetic texts punctuate the piece, inviting audiences on an introspective journey at the heart of the creative process.

MOSAÏCO stands as a powerful work at the intersection of cultures and disciplines, celebrating the beauty of hybridity and artistic diversity.



#### **CONCERT: LUNA LLENA**

For over 20 years, Compagnie Rassegna has brought Mediterranean popular music to life, passionately exploring a rich and diverse repertoire that spans generations and transcends time.

At the helm of this nomadic and multilingual ensemble is composer and musical storyteller Bruno Allary, who takes audiences on a captivating journey through timeless melodies that resonate with our collective memory.

Love songs, protest chants, work laments, and festive celebrations make up the repertoire of this Marseille-based company. Blending centuries-old traditions, 1950s classics, and original compositions, their music is a living, breathing material, shaped into bold arrangements where raw voices, electric textures, and rugged rhythms lay bare the intensity of emotion.

Rather than nostalgia, it is vitality that drives the music, a raw, sincere energy that embraces both joy and sorrow.

A powerful and grounded performance, where forgotten songs reclaim their full evocative force.



## THEATER: BARRAGE CONTRE LE PACIFIQUE

This play is a new adaptation of a novel by Marguerite Duras, brought to the stage by Maud Andrieux.

We are in 1930s Indochina. A French woman lives with her two children, Suzanne and Joseph, on an isolated concession along the river. The land is barren, uncultivable, relentlessly eroded by the sea. Yet the mother refuses to give up. She tirelessly builds and rebuilds dams to protect the crops, hoping to improve the lives of local farmers and save children from hunger and cholera.

It is the stubborn dream of a woman standing tall in the face of injustice, a fierce utopia defying the colonial order.

The dam, endlessly destroyed, becomes the symbol of a life seemingly doomed to failure... or a life of resistance. Because there is something worse than seeing one's work collapse: doing nothing, building nothing.


